A discussion forum is a great tool for learning purposes. To guarantee, that everybody uses the forum in a respectful manner please keep these guidelines in mind:

· Be polite.

We have learners with different knowledge levels. Something that is easy for you may be challenging for someone else. Let's build an encouraging community. Remember to comment on the ideas of an argument, not on the people they come from.

Search before asking.

The forum can become hard to use if there are too many threads, and good discussions happen when people participate in the same thread. Before asking a question, use the search feature.

Write clearly.

We know that English might be a second language for many of you, but correct grammar will help others. Avoid ALL CAPS, abbrv of wrds (abbreviation of words), and excessive punctuation!!!! Please check your spelling prior to posting.

Give useful answers

In responding the discussion questions posted, please answer the question completely. Please think about supporting your answers with scientific evidence e.g. appropriate sources. Please give positive and constructive feedback.
